Diocesan & Deanery Report - Father Perez

- **DOA Strategic Plan** Father reviewed the strategic plan. Pointing out sections that we should consider particularly for our parish. We should consider taking on a fall Service Day project for the community. If anyone has some ideas, submit them to Father Perez. See the Diocese Strategic plan for the six pillars.
- Bishop's Lenten Appeal 59 Pledges Made; 33% of 177 Households; BLA Goal: \$15,000;
 Amount Pledged: \$19,030; 88% Paid Cash, Percentage of BLA Goal: 127%
- Jubilee Year Bishop Burbidge reinforced a message of HOPE in our troubled world.
- Diocese Quarterly Meeting Discussion around the interest in a Catholic Vocation Technical School
- **Bio Ethics Workshop:** Sister Therese of the Dominican Sisters will be presenting a workshop in September.

Knights of Columbus Report

- Dave Wittich reported he has been extremely busy with KOC involvement. The new officer installation will be held on Sunday, August 10 at 1pm with a dinner to honor Past Grand Knights.
- Knights collected for Life Care Center at the end of May at Walmart. They collected a total of \$3,000 in goods and monetary donations. The Center was very pleased and grateful for the donations. Also stated WPER radio station held a diaper drive at the same time.

Our Ladies Council Report

- The last meeting was held this month. Meetings will resume in September. There has been some discussion on reorganizing with different committees and inviting members of parish to get involved in them. IE: Hospitality, Bereavement, Picnic, Christmas Party, etc.
- Rose Ann Smythe mentioned about filling in the area in front of the church entrance. Recently a parish member took a bad fall in the planter bed. Currently the area has pavers in place but want to fill the area with a solid concrete surface. Bids came in as high as \$7,200; Dawson Comer gave a bid of \$5,000 to do the job. Ladies Council will make a donation for the work to be done and parish will pick up the rest of the cost—to be completed after July 1.

Please note this clarification from Susan King who was not able to attend the meeting.

In reading the part about the plan to add cement to the front of the church, there is a little confusion on it. The pavers are there to stay - at this time. The quotes for adding cement are to the two patches of grass in front of the church that go up to the circle drive. They are quite uneven and that is where parishioners have fallen and even one broke an ankle a while back. I just wanted the information to be clear as to the plan. Putting cement where that grass is now, will add a larger solid surface, like a piazza or patio, for people to gather after masses.

Music Ministry Report

- Sandra reported the music ministry participated in 110 masses. Other activities included Caroling,
 Nativity Play, Music Adoration Hours etc.
- Using the new space for practice and storage. Bell choir will still need to use annex for practice.
- She has applied for a \$2000 grant for parish music ministry.

Youth Group Ministry Report

- Joel reported on the Youth Ministry. Meetings are on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays. Meetings consist of Mass, gospel education, food, and games
- They just completed a two-year Bible study on gospels of St. John.
- Working on a peer-to-peer project. Age range considered for group is participation up to 25 years old.

New Construction Project

- Files sent to the Ward Jones at the Diocese Building Commission. Bishop replied back to Father Perez with a letter.
- A Zoom meeting is planned for June 18 with Father Perez, Phil King and the Commission and they will
 consider everything sent in and along with discussion will make the final determination about building
 a new church.

New Business

- Kathy Murphy asked if the council might want to consider the time of the parish council meeting so
 that we did not have to drive in the dark. No decision was made. More discussion at next meeting in
 July.
- Kathy Murphy shared a suggested Guidelines on Parish Council Policies which she, Rose Ann and Susan developed based on diocese recommendations. Members should read carefully and there will be a special council meeting in July to go over them and discuss. Input from all is encouraged.
